DIVERSIFYING YOUR DAIRY WITH BEEF

Dr. Tara Felix is an Assistant Professor of Beef Cattle Nutrition and Management in the Department of Animal Science where she is a member of the Livestock Extension Team and the state Extension Beef Specialist. Dr. Felix grew up on a small hobby farm in Northwest Pennsylvania. She attended Penn State University and graduated with her bachelor's degree in Animal Biosciences. Dr. Felix pursued her master's degree in ruminant nutrition at the University of Florida. After her MS, she spent 3 years obtaining a doctorate at The Ohio State University in beef cattle nutrition and management. Upon graduation, Dr. Felix accepted a position at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. At IL, she spent 4 years and obtained over a million dollars to fund her research investigating the effects of alternative feeds on growth performance and ruminal metabolism of beef cattle.

In January 2016, Dr. Felix rejoined the faculty at her first alma mater, Penn State University.

As part of her extension appointment, she continues her applied research on feed additives and other technologies used to promote beef cattle performance and improve nutrient digestion.
